- Relax with family and friends.


I want to welcome each of you back to our Chapter's fabulous Annual Conference and I hope to see as many of you as the Ritz-Carlton can accommodate.

# Lifetime Achievement Award

## William A. Blincoe, MD | Piedmont Heart Institute



Dr. William Blincoe was born in Midland, Texas April 30, 1953. Raised in the midwest, primarily Wichita, Kansas, with 3 siblings and wonderful, loving parents. He grew up always wanting to be a physician if he could not be a professional athlete. He decided to "go away" for college at Northwestern University in Evanston, Illinois, graduating in 1975. He tried to play football but again was reminded this was not going to make a career. He went to med school at the University of Kansas School of Medicine in Kansas City, Kansas and graduated in 1979. He completed his first two years of Medicine residency at the University of Texas Health Science Center in San Antonio, Texas and his last year of Medicine residency at Emory Affiliated Hospitals in Atlanta, Georgia. He started a cardiology fellowship in 1982 at Emory under Dr. J. Willis Hurst. The fellowship program was one of the

largest in the nation at the time with over 50 fellows. A truly exciting time to be "in training" with the advent of coronary angioplasty and other cardiovascular advances in the early 1980's.

Dr. Blincoe joined a small cardiology practice based at Piedmont in 1985. Over time this group grew, morphed and merged with the culmination of the development of the Piedmont Heart Institute in 2007. He practiced general and interventional cardiology from the outset but retired from the cath lab in 2017. He has held a variety of clinical, governance and leadership positions at Piedmont Hospital and Piedmont Heart Institute. Currently, Bill is Chief of Staff of the Physician Enterprise for Piedmont Healthcare, supporting over 1000 physicians and 600 advanced practice providers. He still takes call and has clinic two times a week but spends majority of his time with administrative duties.

Dr. Blincoe is a Fellow of the American College of Cardiology since 1985. He is a proud founding member of the Georgia ACC Foundation. He will be happy to tell you about the Foundation!

Dr. Blincoe is happily married to Marti Blincoe for 43 years. He moved to Atlanta and able to transfer to Emory "for love" in 1981. Marti and Bill have 3 daughters and now three son-in-law's with five grandchildren, all living in Atlanta, Georgia.

# <u>Dr. Nanette Kass Wenger</u> Award for Excellence in Research and Scholarship



Dr. Nanette Kass Wenger was born September 3, 1930 in New York to parents who had emigrated from Russia to the United States and settled in New York. In 1951 she graduated summa cum laude from Hunter College in New York. She received her doctor of medicine degree from Harvard Medical School in 1954 as one of their first female graduates, and began her postgraduate work at Mount Sinai Hospital in New York, where she became the first woman to be chief resident in the cardiology department. After her residency, she moved to Emory University, where she started

as an instructor and eventually was named full professor of medicine in 1971. Over the course of her career, Wenger became one of the first doctors to focus on heart disease in women, since this disease was initially thought to primarily affect men. In 1993 Wenger co-wrote a landmark review article that demonstrated that cardiovascular disease does similarly affect women since, at the time, women were more likely than men to die from the disease. She has devoted the rest of her career to understand how heart disease, specifically coronary artery disease, affects women as well as advocating for the need to disaggregate study results and report gender-specific analyses from clinical trials.

## <u>Dr. Robert M. Nerem</u> Award for Excellence in Biomedical Research



Robert M. Nerem was born on July 20, 1937 and died March 7, 2020. He received his M.Sc. from in 1961 and his Ph.D. in 1964 from Ohio State University. He joined the faculty at Ohio State in the Department of Aeronautical and Astronautical Engineering, being promoted to Professor in 1972 and serving from 1975-1979 as Associate Dean for Research in the Graduate School. From 1979 to 1986 he was Professor and Chairman of the Department of Mechanical Engineering at the University of Houston. Nerem joined Georgia Tech in 1987 as the Parker

H. Petit Distinguished Chair for Engineering in Medicine. He also was associate Director of the NSF Science and Technology Center for the Emergent Behavior of Integrated Cellular Systems, Director of the Georgia Tech/Emory Center (GTEC) for Regenerative Medicine and from 1995 to 2009 was the Founding Director of the Parker H. Petit Institute for Bioengineering and Bioscience, an interdisciplinary organization for biochemistry, bioengineering, and biology. His research interests included biomechanics, cardiovascular devices, cellular engineering, vascular biology, and tissue engineering and regenerative medicine. He is the author of more than 200 publications in refereed articles and 84 publications in book chapters and non-refereed articles, and of two patents.

#### Peter Hanna, MD, PhD
