

WHO WE ARE: The mission of the <u>Georgia Perinatal Quality Collaborative</u> is to establish, maintain, and engage stakeholders in evidence-based practices to improve health outcomes for mothers and babies throughout Georgia. GaPQC leads statewide implementation of quality improvement initiatives through technical assistance, quality improvement training, education, and data support to hospitals.

The GaPQC was born in November 2012 when a group of neonatologists, obstetricians, midwives, public health professionals and other stakeholders came together to identify and implement quality improvement strategies to advance maternal and neonatal care and outcomes. Georgia is the first state in the country to implement the Alliance for Innovation on Maternal Health's (AIM) Cardiac Conditions in Obstetrical Care (CCOC) patient safety bundle. The goal of the CCOC initiative is to reduce severe morbidity and mortality related to maternal cardiac conditions in Georgia. GaPQCs AIM will reduce harm related to existing and pregnancy related cardiac conditions through the 4th trimester by 20%.

Objectives include:

- 1. Readiness: Implementation of standard processes for optimal care of cardiac conditions in pregnancy and postpartum.
- 2. Recognition & Prevention: Screening and early diagnosis of cardiac conditions in pregnancy and post-partum.
- 3. Response: Care management for every pregnant or postpartum woman with cardiac conditions in pregnancy and post-partum.
- 4. Reporting/System Learning: Foster a culture of safety and improvement for care of women with cardiac conditions in pregnancy and post-partum.
- 5. Respectful, Equitable, and Supportive Care: Inclusion of the patient as part of the multidisciplinary care team.
